

Dear New Plymouth church family,

Summer vacation is drawing to a close, and school starts on September 1. It has been a good summer!



Family – We got to spend a few days over at the ocean with my parents, my youngest brother (#4), and my other brother (#2) and his fiancée. We got to play in the sand, ride kayaks, swim, spearfish, go fishing, do a little fireworks, and watch the Olympics when it was raining – overall, a great time. I had sorely missed swimming in the ocean and spearfishing, so it was nice to do that again with my brothers.

Lana is now teething, which is great, but she's not sleeping well at all, which is not great. She's pretty bossy and likes making us well aware of when she is not pleased – her personality fits right in with the rest of us.

Kai has started to get used to his swimming lessons, so that's been great, as we're planning to try out preschool a couple of days a week from September.

Kira is her normal bubbly crazy self. We've spent quite a bit of time this summer catching little fish, frogs, crabs, tadpoles, shrimp, and other little creatures in the nearby creeks, so she is loving that.

I'm sort of frantically trying to finish prepping for the new classes I have this upcoming semester. I'm not nearly as ready as I wish, so that part is dreadful, but I'm really excited for the opportunity to teach all of these young people.

Simone has probably had the least restful summer of any of us,




dealing with nursing Lana at night and coming up with things to do with the kids during the day while I'm working. We're still hoping that she can make some really sweet mom friends who live nearby.

<u>A new part-time job</u> – One of the international law firms that I



mentioned in my last newsletter hired me on the spot! Praise the Lord! I now teach legal English to the younger attorneys as well as some basic business law concepts in a lecture format. So far, I have worked on contract review and document translation. The lawyers there have been very pleased with my work product. Thank you so much for your prayers. This was an incredibly quick answer to prayer.

<u>School fundraising</u> – The school that I work for, Kyoto International University (http://www.kyotoiu.ac.jp/en/), is still progressing on constructing a new campus. A Christian couple in Hong Kong has confirmed that it will lend the school \$1 million, interest-free, to cover the \$1 million shortfall that resulted from an erroneous estimate by the general contractor. We are incredibly thankful for this, and I want to thank you folks back there – your prayer warriors have been tirelessly praying for this shortfall issue, as well as the other seemingly weekly setbacks. We covet your prayers!



RISE – Our young people program RISE (www.rise-kyotanabe.wixsite.com/website) has been meeting throughout the summer. I'm hopeful that having something readily accessible there on campus after school on a weekday will entice some more non-Christian students to check it out once school starts again. We also started RISE Kids, which the children or younger siblings of volunteers and attendees can attend during the main program.

Prayer requests:

1. Money for the school campus project and favor with the bank. Of all the things to go wrong, after learning of the incoming \$1 million interest-free loan, the original bank stated that it may not release the remaining \$900,000 that the school was expecting in loan funds. The bank believes that the school has too much debt . . . but the bank also needs the building to be completed in order to have a completed building as valuable collateral. It's sort of mind-boggling and frustrating, but God has gotten this project this far. Please pray for additional donations as well as for favor with the bank. As I mentioned last month, I still believe that the school needs a gym so that the school can host sports events, sports ministries, community sports teams (i.e., kind of

have a gym for our own practices (we currently drive buses to local gyms that we rent), host Christian concerts and conferences, be a designated refuge area in the event of natural disasters or emergencies, and give the school a revenue source by renting it out when we don't need it.

2. RISE.

Greetings from Zambia



Hey there!

My name is Hannah Lingel and I currently live in Zambia! My mom grew up in New Plymouth First Baptist Church, the daughter of Gus Wiebe and stepdaughter of Dorothy Wiebe. My dad's side of the family have also been long-time members of the church. I've spent my fair share of time there and can vividly remember going to a VBS, led by the wonderful Cathy, when I was seven or eight. This church has always treated my family with such love and care.

I live and work in a small community in Zambia with an organization called One Collective. One Collective aims to empower communities so that no one is invisible, and everyone has access to food, freedom, and forgiveness. Here in our community of Chibolya, we have a few different aspects to our ministry. We have a ministry farm where we train and disciple locals in Farming God's Way. It is a beautiful way to connect scripture to agriculture. Unfortunately, I know nothing about farming, but luckily, I have two wonderful teammates who manage the farm.

Another aspect of our ministry are Bible studies and Empowerment programs. This is where my job comes in. I currently work with a group of 9 women teaching them business skills as well as discipling them and talking about Jesus. After four months, each of the women will receive a small micro-loan to help grow their business. Our program has been going for about three months now and the women have been such a blessing to me! They always come eager to learn and answer our discussion questions. I am beyond excited to see where this group goes with their businesses and in their faiths. Most of the women in my group are small shop owners where they sell vegetables such as tomatoes, peppers, potatoes, cabbage, etc. Even a small loan like ours will help them grow and expand their business as long as God is in the center.

I am also responsible and have the privilege of taking charge of our Youth Bible study. Our youths age from 13-18 and have been an absolute joy to get to know. We play games, eat muffins, and most importantly talk about Jesus. Each week brings a different number of kids and usually one new face. I've had weeks with five kids, and I've had weeks with

20 kids. It's always crazy, but always fun!



Now, a little about Zambia. Zambia is a landlocked country in the southern part of Africa. Because we are in the Southern Hemisphere, we just finished our winter months (June-August). There are three seasons here: cold, hot, and rainy. Zambia has a population of about 17.9 million and their official language is actually English!



Fun Facts About Zambia:

- Termite hills in Zambia can be as large as a small house.
- The currency is called the Kwatcha and the current exchange is 1 Kwatcha = 0.060 USD.
- It is home to the impressive Victoria Falls, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World! These falls
 are twice the height of Niagara Falls.
- Zambia is home to the "Big Five" animals of lions, leopards, rhinos, elephants, and buffalo.

I found an interesting take on batteries of all things and wanted to share it with you. It gives you something to think about in its simplicity. "When a flashlight grows dim or quits working, do you just throw it away? Of course not. You change the batteries. When a person messes up or finds themselves in a dark place, do you cast them aside? Of course not. You help them change their batteries. Some

Attention, Affection and Acceptance; some need C... Compassion, some need D... Direction. And if they still don't seem to shine...Simply sit with them quietly and share your light." Of course, the only True Light we can ever know is Our Lord Jesus Christ. He is the Light of the World. He tells us to be Light and Salt in this world. With Jesus in our hearts, we are always in the Light. Praise His Name. "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law. Love your neighbor as yourself. Love does no harm to its neighbor. Therefore, love is the fulfillment of the law. And do this understanding the Present Time. The hour has come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the Armor of Light." (Romans13:8-12)

I love a great analogy especially when it gives me insight into His Word and Will for me. I found the following article in the paper recently and they aren't that easy to find as a rule. The author is Loren Yadon and he is Pastor of New Life Fellowship in Boise. I have read other articles where the writer used the example of the Titanic. One referred to the fact that it was subpar grommets that caused the ship's wall to fail. I'm sharing a portion of this article. "The Titanic received six warnings of sea ice on April 14, but it was traveling at 22 knots, near top speed. The ship was not able to avoid a glancing starboard blow that tore open six of her 16 compartments. The damage was too extensive, and the crew suddenly realized the ship would sink. They put out distress flares and radio messages to nearby ships as passengers were put into the 20 lifeboats on board. Poor management of the evacuation plan sent many lifeboats away before they were completely full. Almost all of those who jumped or fell overboard either drowned or died within minutes, a result of the frigid water. There were more than 1,000 passengers and crew still aboard when the ship sank 12,500 feet beneath the calm surface of the sea. I think the Titanic is symbolic of what we are experiencing today. We are a culture that has arrogantly continued to travel full speed in disobedience and in spite of the repeated warnings of Scripture. After all, man thinks he is smart enough that he doesn't need God for direction through the dangers of history. Officially, man has taken prayer out of our public schools, wantonly taken the lives of babies, betrayed

Officially, man hat taken prayer out of our public schools, wantonly taken the lives of babies, betrayed marriage partners, and thrown off the restraints of law and order. Each violation of God's moral code has opened a breach in the "hull" of our safety, and the waters of judgement are pouring in! When the passengers realized their true fate aboard the Titanic, their only concern was

to find one of the pitifully few lifeboats that provided their only hope of survival. In our sinking world, there is only one source of hope, one lifeboat, one Savior, who is Jesus the risen Christ. He said He came into the world to save people from "perishing" (John 3:16) He also boldly proclaimed that He was the only one who could save us (John 8:24; 14:6). You might think His claim as the only Savior was an exaggeration, but are you willing to take a chance that another lifeboat will come along—with the "ship" listing to the starboard so drastically?"
