Called Business Meeting June 26, 2022 - 12:30 pm Good Times Entertainment Center

Rod Elson started the meeting

Mike Wherry opened in prayer.

Pastor Phil presented the ad hoc committee needs. Usher passed out papers with the lists of nominations.

- 1. Steering Committee: This consists of
 - a. Phil Pittman Pastor
 - b. Dan Cook Chairman of Trustees
 - c. Rod Elson Chairman of Deacons
 - d. Ryan Kerby Chairman of Finance Committee
 - e. Troy Jones Staff on Board of CE

The Steering Committee started meeting almost immediately after the fire. This committee will support all the other committees and will cease to exist when the building is dedicated.

Motion made by Robin Elson to accept the nominees on the Steering Committee. Seconded by Bob Zillner. Motion passed unanimously.

2. Need Assessment Committee. Troy Jones is the chairperson. This committee has 20 plus people who will look at other churches and assess the needs of the ministry going forward. Christina Ingalls asked to be included on that committee.

This committee should complete its work in 6-8 weeks. There will be a meeting tomorrow night (6/27/2022) at 6:30 pm at Good Times Entertainment.

Motion made by Bob Zillner to accept the nominees on the Needs Assessment committee. Seconded by Todd Dickard. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Building Design Committee. This committee is co-chaired by Ryan Kerby and Dan Cook. This committed has nearly 25 plus people and will start when the needs assessment committee has completed their work. This committee will be responsible for what the church will look like. David Ingalls asked to be included on that committee. Brian Combie is listed on the Needs Assessment Committee and would like to be included on the Building Design Committee.

Motion made by Bob Brown to accept the nominees on the Building Design Committee. Seconded by Steve Wood. Motion passed unanimously.

4. Fundraising Committee: This committee is chaired by Dustin Michaelson. That committee has about 10 members. They are tasked with reaching out and getting contributions for the rebuild. Angie Buck asked to be included on that committee.

Motion made by Becky Wood to accept the nominees on the Fundraising Committee. Seconded by Troy Jones. Motion passed unanimously.

5. Prayer Team: This committee will be looking for God's Guidance as we move forward. Steph Wherry asked to be included on that committee.

Motion made by Penny Goss to accept the nominees on the Prayer Team Committee. Seconded by Bob Foust. Motion passed unanimously.

Pastor Phil stated that these committees were not set in stone. Chairpersons will contact the nominees to make sure they want to serve on their committee. Anyone who does not want to serve will have their name stricken.

Rod Elson was told there was an error printed in the Argus Observer that Dan Chadwick, attorney for the City of New Plymouth, represented both the City and FBC. Dan Chadwick does not represent the First Baptist Church as stated in the article. We will clarify where this information came from and if necessary, have a retraction printed.

Expenditures: Lee Pounds explained that the insurance policy had Continuity Section (keeping the church running), that is for \$160,000. This money will be used for tents (classrooms), office equipment, music equipment, audio/visual equipment, etc. A motion was made to allow leadership to expense continuity monies as needed. The Steering Committee will have oversight.

Motion made by Gloria Blair and seconded by Kathie Brown. Motion passed unanimously.

Contents will need to be listed room by room. Lee Pounds asked people to start lists. We may go into the church, provided we wear hard soled shoes, mask, gloves and a hard hat. Those items will be provided. Lists should be completed with name printed and signed in case there are questions.

Cleanup of the Church: An excavator will be there in mid-July. There is a \$25,000 limit for cleanup. The cost will probably run about \$100,000. Any money over the insurance allowance will come out of rebuild money.

Motion made by Bob Zillner to accept allow spending on cleanup. Seconded by Cody Kramer. Motion passed unanimously.

There was discussion about why we need to fill up the basement. (Required by city code) A couple of people stated they knew of places that would take concrete with rebar in Weiser and Ontario. They are to get the information.

Meeting was closed in prayer by Chris Burell. Minutes submitted by Nancy Hollaway for Tana Hunsucker.

This was my lot when I returned home that afternoon a "snowstorm" of sawdust covered the room that housed the computer, etc. and winter clothes hanging in said closet. I began the task of cleaning. I left the task of rehanging them to his skill set. An hour or so went b at which time he declared that "He was unable to do the job and would have to wait for Jon to arrive form California later that week. He proceeded to seat himself in anticipation of said event. As I look back, I didn't waste time on a rant (His power at work). I looked the situation over and could see exactly how they needed to be put back. Claiming his word for strength, I lifted the first door and He guided it to the right track. On to the second door, I felt like an expert by now. I Thanked and Praise Him for His Provision for keeping me quiet and Trusting. I then gathered up the tools and I believe I literally "marched" out to the living room. The shocked look on Joseph's face was priceless. I then shred with him how I had Claimed His A Memory of Chrissy Word.

As I write today, I'm very mindful of my beloved Sister in Christ, Chrissy Kramer. Chrissy was dealing with the effects of her compromised liver. For everyone who had the privilege and Joy of having Chrissy in their lives, you know what a precious gift she was to this world. She and Glenn came into my life almost forty years ago and I have never stopped loving them. Chrissy and I have shared so may VBS adventures, Christmas Plays, Kid's Blast, Bible Study and a passionate Love for All God's Creatures. I would always call on her to look after my kitties and menagerie when I had to be gone. Even those times when Joseph was home, she was there. "Because he just didn't know how to do it right.' One summer we were flying to Japan to meet Jake. I enlisted both her and Dixie for Critter duty. At the time my kitty Possum needed meds applied inside his ears. He and his brother Maxi looked a lot alike. As time went by, Chrissy began to question if she was medicating the right kitty. Dixie called my Mom for help, telling her, "Chrissy doesn't want Penny to ever know." With Mom's help they were able to put the right name to a face. Possum started to act like himself, and Maxie hadn't really minded the extra attention. It would be a few years before I shared with Chrissy that I knew, and what a good laugh she had given Mom. My furry family has always loved Chrissy. They know a purrfect heart when they meet one. Chrissy blessed everyone whose lives she touched, human and animal alike. Please keep her and her family in your prayers. And remember, "You can do all things through Christ Jesus who strengthens you." Jesus said that.




The past month or so, we have been going through a series on the Prodigal Son from Luke chapter 15. I believe it has been such an impactful time for these kids. The past week we started diving deeper into the topic of grace through the story and lens

of the Prodigal Son. There is no sin too great that God does not welcome us back with open arms. There is also nothing more that we can do to make God love us any more than he already does. I think this is an especially impactful statement for the kids. In Zambia (and not so different from the U.S.), church and Christianity are cultural. Kids are taught to go to church, read the Bible, pray, and do all of the "right" Christian things. But doing these things doesn't save us. Jesus saves us. We tell the kids that these are not bad things, in fact we should do these things because we love God. But these acts do not make God love us anymore. We are not



saved through works; we are saved through the grace of God in the act of love of him sending Jesus.

Some of these kids have gone through tough things in their life. I think many of them feel like they have to do all of the right things to feel loved and accepted. Telling them that God loves and accepts them no matter what they do, can be a foreign concept. As we learn and read about the father's open arms in the story of the Prodigal Son, these kids are starting to understand just how unconditional that love is.


